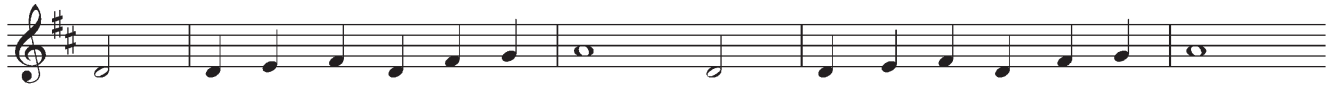

THE INSTALLATION OF A CANON OF THE CATHEDRAL

The dean presents Jon Ellis Meacham to the bishop to be installed as canon historian in the Cathedral Church of Saint Peter and Saint Paul.

The bishop examines the canon-elect of his willingness to commit to this new trust.

The bishop addresses the people.

Bishop Dear People of God, will you who witness this new beginning support and uphold this ministry?
People **We will, with God's help.**

The canon-elect is presented with the Book of Common Prayer, the Holy Bible, and a medal.

The bishop installs the canon-elect.

The new canon is escorted to the stall symbolic of the office and prays aloud.

New Canon Almighty and eternal God, so draw my heart to you, so guide my mind, so fill my imagination, so control my will, that I may be wholly yours, utterly dedicated to you; and then use me, I pray, as you will, and always to your glory and the welfare of your people; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

The chaplains are presented with the Holy Bible and a tippet.

The bishop installs the chaplains.

The chaplains are escorted to the stalls symbolic of the office and pray aloud.

Chaplains Remember us, O Lord, as you have in ages past. You made the world and our human race; you shaped its history, correcting your people with judgment yet with love. We thank you for this our United States of America, for its liberty and freedom Give us grace to carry out your work; and send your blessing upon those who are in our care; for your mercy endures forever and we give you thanks, for you alone are good. Blessed be God forever!

The bishop presents the chaplains; the people greet them with applause.
