



THE FIRST READING


Revelation 7:9–17

After this John looked, and there was a great multitude that no one could count, from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages, standing before the throne and before the Lamb, robed in white, with palm branches in their hands. They cried out in a loud voice, saying, "Salvation belongs to our God who is seated on the throne, and to the Lamb!" And all the angels stood around the throne and around the elders and the four living creatures, and they fell on their faces before the throne and worshiped God, singing, "Amen! Blessing and glory and wisdom and thanksgiving and honor and power and might be to our God forever and ever! Amen." Then one of the elders addressed me, saying, "Who are these, robed in white, and where have they come from?" I said to him, "Sir, you are the one that knows." Then he said to me, "These are they who have come out of the great ordeal; they have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb. For this reason they are before the throne of God, and worship him day and night within his temple, and the one who is seated on the throne will shelter them. They will hunger no more, and thirst no more; the sun will not strike them, nor any scorching heat; for the Lamb at the center of the throne will be their shepherd, and he will guide them to springs of the water of life, and God will wipe away every tear from their eyes."


PSALM 34:1–10, 22 chant: Dettra

THE GOSPEL Matthew 5:1–12

Gospeller The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew.

THE PRESENTATION OF THE BAPTISMAL CANDIDATES

Canon Cope The candidates for Holy Baptism will now be presented.

The candidates unable to answer for themselves are presented individually by their parents and sponsors.

Sponsors I present N. to receive the Sacrament of Baptism.

Canon Cope Will you be responsible for seeing that the child you present is brought up in the Christian faith and

life?

Sponsors I will, with God's help.

Canon Cope Will you by your prayers and witness help this child to grow into the full stature of Christ?

Sponsors I will, with God's help.

THE EXAMINATION

Canon Cope Do you renounce Satan and all the spiritual forces of wickedness that rebel against God?

Sponsors I renounce them.

Canon Cope Do you renounce the evil powers of this world which corrupt and destroy the creatures of God?

Sponsors I renounce them.

Canon Cope Do you renounce all sinful desires that draw you from the love of God?

Sponsors I renounce them.

Canon Cope Do you turn to Jesus Christ and accept him as your Savior?

Sponsors I do.

Canon Cope Do you put your whole trust in his grace and love?

Sponsors I do.

Canon Cope Do you promise to follow and obey him as your Lord?

Sponsors I do.

After all have been presented, the Canon Cope addresses the congregation, saying

Canon Cope Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support these persons in their life in Christ?

THE BAPTISMAL COVENANT

Canon Cope Let us join with those who are committing themselves to Christ and renew our own baptismal covenant.

Canon Cope Do you believe in God the Father?

People I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Canon Cope Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

People I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit

and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at

the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

Canon Cope Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

People I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of

sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.

Canon Cope Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers?

People I will, with God's help.

Canon Cope Will you persevere in resisting evil, and, whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord?

People I will, with God's help.

Canon Cope Will you proclaim by word and example the Good News of God in Christ?

People I will, with God's help.

Canon Cope Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbor as yourself?

People I will, with God's help.

Canon Cope Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being?

People I will, with God's help.

THANKSGIVING OVER THE WATER

Canon Cope The Lord be with you.

People And also with you.

Canon Cope Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People It is right to give him thanks and praise.

We thank you, Almighty God, for the gift of water. Over it the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation. Through it you led the children of Israel out of their bondage in Egypt into the land of promise. In it your Son Jesus received the baptism of John and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the Christ, to lead us, through his death and resurrection, from the bondage of sin into everlasting life. We thank you, Father, for the water of Baptism. In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit. Therefore in joyful obedience to your Son, we bring into his fellowship those who come to him in faith, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Now sanctify this water, we pray you, by the power of your Holy Spirit, that those who here are cleansed from sin and born again may continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Savior. To him, to you, and to the Holy Spirit, be all honor and glory, now and for ever. **Amen.**

your servants the forgiveness of sin, and have raised them to the new life of grace. Sustain them, O Lord, in your Holy Spirit. Give them an inquiring and discerning heart, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love you, and the gift of joy and wonder in all your works. Amen.

Canon Cope Let us welcome the newly baptized.

All We receive you into the household of God. Confess the faith of Christ crucified, proclaim his

resurrection, and share with us in his eternal priesthood.






