INTRODUCTION TO THE SERVICE

God calls us to follow Christ, and forms us into a royal priesthood, a holy nation, to declare the wonderful deeds of the One who has called us out of darkness into marvelous light. The Church is the Body of Christ, the people of God, the dwelling-place of the Holy Spirit. In baptism, God summons the whole church to witness to holy love and to work for the coming reign of Christ.

To serve this royal priesthood, God has given a variety of ministries.

Deacons are ordained so that the people of God may be better equipped to make Christ known through a ministry of visible self-giving. Christ is the pattern of the deacon's calling and commission; as he washed the feet of his disciples, so deacons must wash the feet of others.

Priests are ordained to lead God's people in the offering of praise and the proclamation of the gospel. With the bishop, they share in the oversight of the Church; delighting in its beauty and rejoicing in its well-being. They set before them, always, the pattern of the Good Shepherd as the example of their calling. With the Bishop and their fellow presbyters, they sustain the community of the faithful by the ministry of word and sacrament, that all may grow into the fullness of Christ, a living sacrifice, acceptable to God.

FIRST LESSON

Isaiah 6:1-8

In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord sitting on a throne, high and lofty; and the hem of his robe filled the temple. But speaking the truth in love, we must grow up in every way into him who is the head, into Christ, from whom the whole body, joined and knit together by every ligament with which it is equipped, as each part is working properly, promotes the body's growth in building itself up in love.

THE EXAMINATION OF ORDINANDS TO THE DIACONATE

Bishop Will you persevere in prayer, both in public and in private, asking God's grace, both for yourself and for others, offering all your labors to God, through the mediation of Jesus Christ, and in the sanctification of the Holy Spirit?

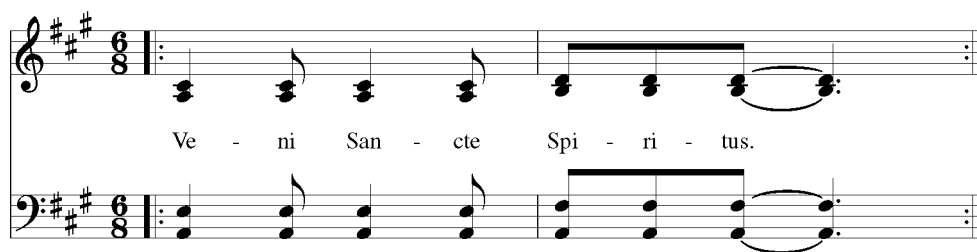

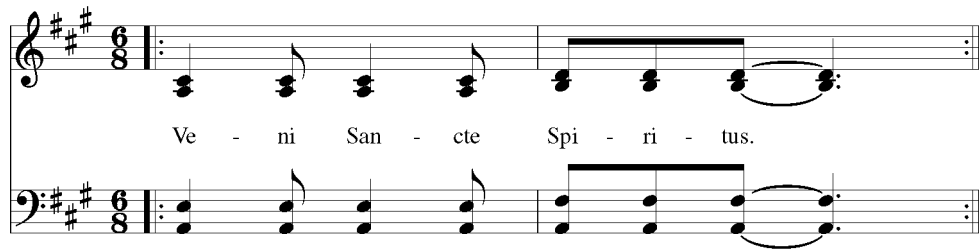

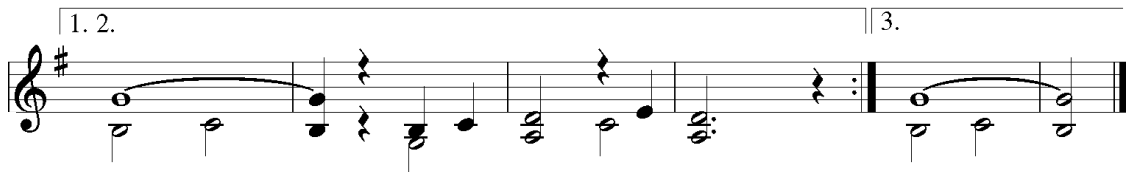
