THE FIRST READING Acts 10:44-48

While Peter was still speaking, the Holy Spirit fell upon all who heard the word. The circumcised believers who had come with Peter were astounded that the gift of the Holy Spirit had been poured out even on the Gentiles, for they heard them speaking in tongues and extolling God. Then Peter said, "Can anyone withhold the water for baptizing these people who have received the Holy Spirit just as we have?" So he ordered them to be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ. Then they invited him to stay for several days.





THE NICENE CREED

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church.

We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins.

We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

We lift them to the Lord.


Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

THE LORD'S PRAYER


Rejoicing in God's new creation, let us pray with confidence, each in our own language, the prayer our Savior has taught us:

God the Son, who in bursting from the grave has won a glorious victory, give you joy as you share the Easter faith.


God the Holy Spirit, who filled the disciples with the life of the risen Lord, empower you and fill you with Christ's
