
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

FIRST READING Rabbi Bruce E. Kahn, Rabbi Emeritus Temple Shalom of Chevy Chase

Genesis 12:1-9

Read in Hebrew. Now the Lord said to Abram, "Go from your country and your kindred and your father's house to the land that I will show you. I will make of you a great nation, and I will bless you, and make your name great, so that you will be a blessing. I will bless those who bless you, and the one who curses you I will curse; and all the families of the earth shall bless themselves by you." So Abram went, as the Lord had told him; and Lot went with him. Abram was seventy-five years old when he departed from Haran. Abram took his wife Sarai and his brother's son Lot, and all the possessions that they had amassed, and the persons whom they had acquired in Haran; and they set forth to go to the land of Canaan. When they had come to the land of Canaan, Abram passed through the land to the place at Shechem, to the oak of Moreh. At that time the Canaanites were in the land. Then the Lord appeared to Abram, and said, "To your offspring I will give this land." So he built there an altar to the Lord, who had appeared to him. From there he moved on to the hill country on the east of Bethel, and pitched his tent, with Bethel on the west and Ai on the east; and there he built an altar to the Lord and invoked the name of the Lord. And Abram journeyed on by stages toward the Negeb.





THE HOLY GOSPEL Matthew 5: 1-12

Grant us every necessary grace to love our neighbors as ourselves. Open our eyes to see the lifegiving and the good in every person and every place. As neighbors become friends, may we work to restore the wonder of the world you have made. Bless all whose lives are closely linked with ours; that we may love one another as you love us.

And also with you.


Lift up your hearts.


THE LORD'S PRAYER

Amen.


God the Son, who in bursting from the grave has won a glorious victory, give you joy as you share the Easter faith.
