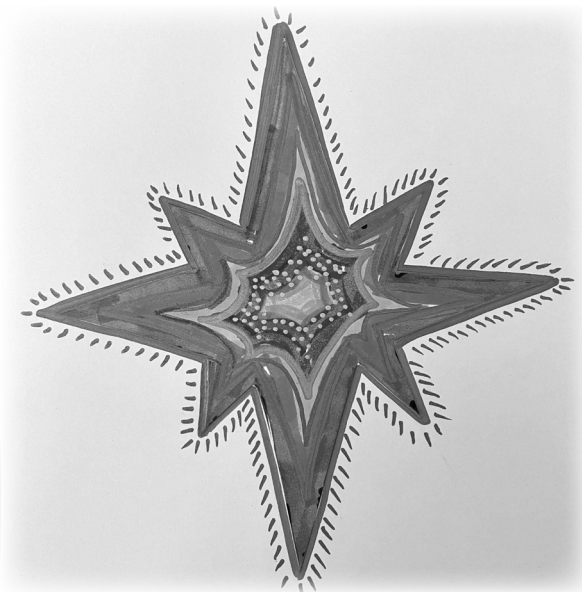


Family CHRISTMAS SERVICE

Hark! the herald angels sing glory to the newborn King!

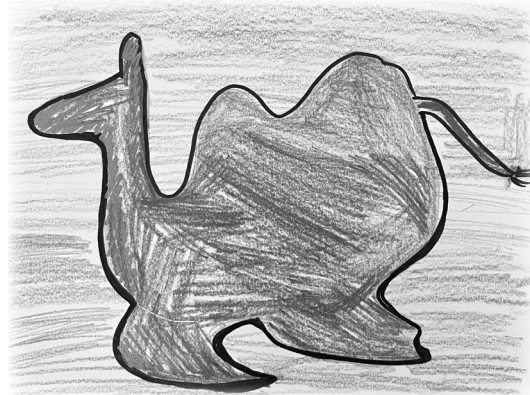
Christ, by highest heaven adored; Christ, the everlasting Lord;
