ABOUT THE COVER IMAGE

Matthew Wayne Shepard (1976–1998) was interred at Washington National Cathedral in October 2018. In 2022, LGBTQ members of the Cathedral staff commissioned artist and iconographer Kelly Latimore (b. 1986) to paint a devotional portrait of Matthew for use in Cathedral services, gatherings, and pilgrimages associated with Matthew and the LGBTQIA+ community and as a means for personal reflection and education about Matthew's life and legacy. The background of the portrait was inspired by the rainbow pride flag and includes phrases and words from letters and cards sent to Matthew's parents, Dennis and Judy Shepard.
